NESCOE seeks persons to provide technical analysis and/or related support (i.e., preparing or assisting in the preparation of comments, filings, presentations) with respect to resource adequacy and system planning and expansion.

Qualified persons will:

- understand the structure, responsibilities and procedures of ISO-New England, Inc. (ISO-NE), the New England Power Pool (NEPOOL), and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC)
- understand ISO-NE's analysis and plans and their implications for consumers
- have knowledge of electric transmission and the power industry
- have demonstrated ability to work collaboratively and effectively with non-technical personnel
- possess excellent written and verbal communication skills

Essential Functions:

Working with NESCOE Managers, staff and technical consultants:

- Review ISO-NE's studies, data, system planning documents and proposals
- Analyze ISO-NE and NEPOOL members'/stakeholders' recommendations and positions on issues related to resource adequacy and system planning and expansion; develop explanation of their implications and related recommendations for NESCOE Managers' consideration
- Develop recommendations with supporting analysis on issues related to resource adequacy and system planning and expansion for NESCOE's consideration
- Attend select regional stakeholder meetings; understand and concisely summarize data, issues and implications
- Interact with representatives of the New England states to understand state-specific concerns and basis for policy preferences
- Provide technical and/or related support (i.e., drafting written communications) to assist NESCOE's contribution to interregional planning activities
- Monitor federal energy matters including FERC filings and issuances relevant to New England; support NESCOE's filings in federal forums by preparing or assisting in the preparation of comments and/or testimony

Desirable qualities include:

- Advanced degree in fields such as engineering, economics, law, business
- Experience in New England's electricity market
- Ability to communicate technical information clearly and concisely
